IV. Curriculum Calendar/Timeline

The course will follow the guidelines of the North Carolina Social Studies Standard Course of Study for World History. This class will follow the textbook "HMM World History .The following is a general class outline:

4 th Quarter	Napoleon and Industrial Revolution Imperialism and Nationalism WWI and Interwar Period WWII and the Cold War Modern Themes

IV. Assessment

Frequent assessment will be used to monitor student's progress throughout each unit. All class materials will be kept in the student's class binder and graded at the end of each unit in the form of a notebook assessment. Notebook assessments will demonstrate the student's understanding of the overarching unit through organization and the completion of all work unit work. More information on notebook assessments will be given prior to the first unit test.

V. Grading Policy

Formal Assessments (70% of final grade)

Formal Assessments- 70%

A formal assessment will consist of mini-assessments, tests, essays, and potential major projects that are used to demonstrate the students understanding of an overarching concept or skill in the class.

Informal Assessments-30%

An informal assessment will consist of in-class work that is collected or graded, classroom discussions and participation in those discussions, homework, and any other informal judgment of a student's understanding of a particular subject or skill learned.

Late Work:

For every day that **assignments are late**, there will be a <u>deduction of 10%</u> to that assignment's grade with a maximum penalty of 50%.

Re-Testing:

Students who earned below a 69% on a formal assessment grade have the opportunity to re-take the assessment to earn up to a 69%. The second attempt will not be the same assessment as the first, although it will assess the same objectives.

*Please note that you are only eligible to re-take an assessment if you have attended 2 tutorial sessions, submitted a study guide, and are not currently missing any assignments from the unit being assessed.
